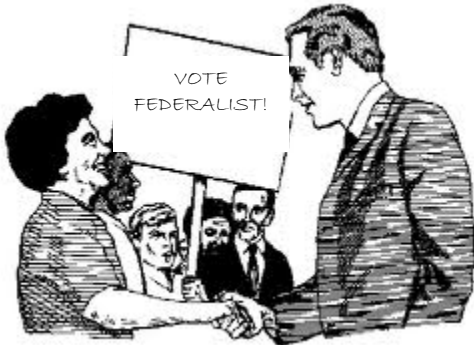


Campaign for your party!

Focus on a central theme. Start by answering the question: What is the most important thing people would want to know about my candidate's party?

Create catchy, creative phrases that summarize the party position on the following:

1. The ideal form of government
2. The economy and the national bank
3. Human nature
4. Relationships with foreign countries
5. One statement should say why YOUR candidate's party is better than the oppositions.
6. Include graphics or symbols that illustrate your candidate's position. Full color is always catchier than white space.

Neatness counts! No one will vote for you if your poster is sloppy, poorly designed, messy, or has spelling errors.
